I am struggling in this covid world to see any other side in the media whether print or visual other than the current one of lockdown, save lives, stay at home, get tested, use the contact tracing app and the like.

What I would like to see in the media are the other options of which there must be many. Our politicians all seem to be on the same page, regardless of their party which leaves me to wonder why.

I would like to see the modellers put forth other models for us to consider. For example, how many people are expected to die by suicide in a lock down?

How many medical operations are on hold during lock down? What impact on general health does that have? How many people can not get their first cancer treatment or diagnosis and how does that impact their lives? How many funerals get cancelled each day? How many people die alone during lockdown?

How many businesses have gone bust and how many more are expected to do so for every day in lockdown? There are many more questions and answers of which I am ignorant because the media is not engaged in this debate.

There is much 'disinformation' on social media sites such as facebook but the question has to be asked, If the mainstream media will not address the above questions then by default less mainstream media will pick it up.

If lockdowns were cancelled what impact would this have on people flocking for their vaccinations?

Would that in itself be sufficient to ease the lockdowns?

Kiwi rock legends join motorbike enthusiasts for first kickdown

Whangamatā is gearing up to host New Zealand's first ever Kickdown Festival on 20 - 23 January 2022.

Highlights of the three-day festival will include the opportunity for motorbike enthusiasts and their passengers to win \$1m cash and be part of the biggest ever posse to 'Ride the Loop' with up to 2000 others whilst taking in the stunning scenery of the Coromandel Peninsula.

The festival will be drawn to a close by Saturday's Kickdown concert, being held at Joe's Farm and featuring the very best of New Zealand rock.

Headlined by rock royalty Shihad, who will be joined by fellow rock legends, Devilskin and Hello Sailor, as well as Kiwi favourites, Stellar, The Jordan Luck Band, Goodshirt and DJs from The Rock.

The Kickdown Festival is being likened by organisers to a bite sized, homegrown version of South Dakota's famous Sturgis Rally.

WRE Community Pool upgrade well underway

Exciting news for the Whangamata Real Estate Community Pool as funding of \$500,000 has been allocated by our Council to help with the overdue upgrade of this important facility.

The pool management team plans to operate the pool all year round, to facilitate this we will be seeking to employ paid lifeguards, this could be an opportunity for seniors with an interest in aquatic activity, training will be provided.

A 12-month season is a great opportunity for locals to train and enjoy the complex throughout the year, while adding an extra attraction to visitors during the winter months.

The funding split over a 2 year period, allows in the first year new heat pumps to be installed, maintaining a water temperature of 28-29 C. At the same time the chlorination plant will be upgraded to meet current specifications, additional maintenance is scheduled, these include new expansion joints and the pool floor and sides painted.

A huge fundraising drive has been quietly taking place with lots of local businesses putting their

hands up to help as well. Without this local support we could not succeed in what we are trying to achieve. The Lion Foundation has helped with the purchase of a new thermal pool cover by contributing \$40,000.00 towards this cost. The old pool cover and reel were transported to a local farm to cover silage.

The Whangamata Club has provided funding for the purchase



of an automated pool-cover winch (Poolie pal), this will result in a more efficient use of lifeguard time and eliminate the daily back breaking effort of manually operating the thermal cover.

Whangamata Lions have assisted with the funding of materials to transform the office into a multiuse facility that will be the Sales Office and Shop. First Windows and Doors have been a great help with the supply of a new office window and thanks to Skeet, of Total Works Carpentry, who removed the old and installed the new look slider.

A big shout out to Stephen and Whangamata Woodworks for their expertise and help with the construction of new cabinetry units for the office. Bunnings has provided paint at no cost, for the office and changing rooms, Jeremy Burton is assisting with the application.

The exterior and interior of the pool surrounds will take on a new look thanks to Boof Boland and his team as they have agreed to supply labour and product to paint these areas at no cost. The team from Menzshed has removed shrubbery from the front and side of the pool surrounds, thanks to Gary Clarkson Contractors for his bobcat skills, a real labour saver. Our local Fire Services from Whangamatā, Whiritoa and Onemana as always assist with the emptying, cleaning and refilling of the pool.

Funding applications have been lodged for the upgrade of the male and female changing rooms, hopes are high that this application will be met favourably.

This will be such a fun venue not only to enjoy a swim, but to relax, catch up with friends, and buy a coffee or an ice cream. Regular sausage sizzles on Saturday afternoons will be an extra attraction. Planning for the new Learn to Swim Therapeutic Pool will take place in 2022, so we have lots to look forward to.



All going well it is planned to open the pool for the 2021/22 season in time for the school holidays October.

Labour must take position on unvaccinated workers

The Government needs to decide how it will handle unvaccinated people in the work force sooner rather than later, National's Workplace Relations spokesperson Scott Simpson says.

"I attempted to raise the issue of employer obligations to provide safe work environments where there are employees who choose to be unvaccinated at Select Committee this morning, but Minister Michael Wood was evasive.

"However, Minister Wood and his Cabinet colleagues need not listen to me on this. I am simply raising an inevitable issue that we are seeing play out in places like the United States right now.

"President Joe Biden has announced a policy whereby Federal workers will face restrictions and regular testing unless they can prove they are vaccinated. Even Walt Disney has made vaccination compulsory for most of its staff.

"In New Zealand, this is going to cause quite a complex legal clash as employer obligations, employee rights, the Human Rights Act, and civil action all come into play.

"Employers won't want to expose their vaccinated employers and customers to unnecessary potential Covid-19 exposure. However, they also do not want to find themselves dealing with personal grievances from people who claim discrimination based on their beliefs and decision not to be vaccinated.

"The Labour Government needs to have answers for employers and employees as confusion around rights will likely result in workplace conflict, lost productivity, and a lot more employment law cases.

"No doubt unions will be formulating their own positions on this and it is imperative the Government isn't lagging behind.

"Minister Wood's suggestion that these kinds of things should be left to 'good will' is ridiculous. Certainty is a rare commodity these days and if the Government abdicates its responsibility on this there will be more uncertainty ahead for employers and employees.

"National encourages all New Zealanders to get vaccinated, however we understand it is unlikely that 100 per cent will. It would be pragmatic and responsible for the Government to be prepared with some solutions to these employment challenges."

Vaccination drive-throughs over next four Sundays – just do it!

On Sunday, I was delighted to get my first Covid vaccine shot. It was remarkably easy, the flow of traffic, well marked into lanes and an array of tents with many health workers getting around the vehicles like busy health bees.

Fully-masked for all, I found it totally painless and the instructions on any adverse reactions were clear, concise and delivered by really happy qualified staff.

Considering on this Sunday, over 560 members of the public came in droves and whisked through and into the carpark waiting area for 20 minutes and then "Yes, you can go!"

Afterwards, Practice Manager, Rebecca Townsend, from Whangamatā Medical Centre spoke to Whangamatā News. "About 10% are no shows for various reasons, the 10% was made up of others coming without bookings including people bringing their 12-year-olds and over and including walk-ins."

The message they sent out on the previous Friday was to push the 17 to 40-year-olds to come along, "it's those groups we really want to encourage to come".

Once we get down to level 1, we will be able to go back into the Medical Centre where distancing is manageable.

When we get to Labour weekend, there will only be a small clinic, so the surrounding businesses don't have cones at frontages.

"We want them to do as well as they can do, and don't want to be in the way of that". So until then, the drive-throughs will continue over the next four Sundays, with plenty of bookings available.

Go to Book My Vaccine | Ministry of

Health NZ (covid19.health.nz) and the site to choose is Whangamatā Community Health.

Townsend also stated "We feel we have definitely broken the back of it, doing this since the 1st of August we have now done 3,300 vaccinations. We opened up to the whole community, not just medical centre patients, accepting anybody that drives up".

Keep in mind the health workers I saw are under the umbrella of Whangamatā Community Health Inc – pharmacists, Pathlab staff, district nurses and hospice nurses came on-board, not just the medical centre staff.

A big acknowledgment to road management staff, a sterling effort.

Note also, that any profits made from MOH funding for vaccinations here go back to our community to serve other health initiatives including the community x-ray.

The drive-through entrance is on Aickin Road opposite Oliver's Bakery. Entry is from Martyn Road end of Aickin Road.

If there are people in the community who are wanting to talk to a nurse please call Whangamatā Medical Centre 07 865 8032.

I encourage **everyone** to come and get vaccinated, do your bit to protect our community and country.

For those out there that you know, who have differing opinions, or are fearful for whatever reason, dont vilify them, encourage them with some facts and kindness. Lets remember what's happening overseas with hospitals filling mostly with the unvaccinated.

Community support revitalises waka ama

The Whangamatā Waka fleet is in great shape thanks to generous support from the Whangamatā community.

At the end of 2020, the club's two six-person waka, Matariki and Kaimua, were in dire need of repair and repainting.

The Whangamatā Ocean Sports Club answered a call for sponsorship and generously funded materials and labour for the project. Whangamatā Woodworks and Altex Coatings supplied the paint.

The beginning of 2021 saw





more good news with The Lions Foundation approving a grant for a brand new waka. The new

waka was built by Moananui and in April it arrived from Whangarei to complete the fleet. We now have three six-person waka in matching red and white Whangamatā colours.

The new waka are being well used with a number of tamariki, youth and adult teams out training. The club had hoped to travel to Waitangi for the Bay of Islands Waka Festival in October but, unfortunately, the race has been cancelled due to Covid-19 restrictions.

Instead, the club will be training locally and exploring our magnificent coastline.

Couple makes their mark for good

Once was not enough for adventurers-atheart Sinclair and Kathy Carter. The Whangamatā couple had not even disembarked their first volunteer service with Mercy Ships on the Africa Mercy last July, when they signed up for a second volunteer tourof-duty on a different hospital ship.

In February, 2021 the Carters joined the small pioneering crew Vol on board the world's inte largest civilian hospital largest ship, Global Mercy. The purpose-built, 37,000 gross tonne ship, paid for by private donations will deliver essential surgery for Africa's under-served poor. The couple were on board as the vessel slipped her berth in China in August, beginning the first international voyage.

"I'm working as Technical administrator so my role is looking after the Deck and Engineering teams," explains Kathy. "I check the credentials of all officers, got endorsements from Malta as necessary, I do rosters, schedules, and basically anything needed to ensure the

smooth running of both the deck and engineering teams."

Sinclair is second engineer on the Global Mercy. "The engineering team are fantastic and working with them has been the real highlight of my time on Mercy Ships', he says. "The community on board is caring, and very supportive of one another—it's like a big extended family and we have made so many amazing memories here."

The voyage to Belgium has included unexpected stop to wait out a cyclone, traversing the Suez Canal, and a brief visit to the tiny ancient but significant port of Malta - where the Mercy Ships are registered. After arriving in Antwerp, outfitting the hospital decks and ship's IT systems begins. Sinclair and Kathy will remain as Global Mercy crew with up to 600 intentional volunteers undertaking the first field surgical service in Sub-Saharan Africa in 2022.

ths and Kathy explains, "We feel strongly about helping the poor of Africa. First and foremost, that is why we have been with Mercy Ships since start of 2020. It appeals to our sense of adventure to travel to countries that we have never been, exploring different cultures and gaining an understanding of how others live. It humbles us

and makes us very grateful for our lives." From correcting cleft lips and palates and congenital deformities, to removing tumours and restoring eyesight, it is estimated that more than 150,000 people's lives will be transformed by surgery on the Global Mercy over the vessel's Books

Scallop ban reaps 2000 submissions

The east Coromandel scallop fishery will close for a period of 2 years from Saturday, 11 September following a request from the Ngāti Hei Trust.

The closure covers scallop fishing in an area extending along the east Coromandel coastline from Anarake Point to Ruahiwihiwi Point, where Ngāti Hei exercise mana moana, and includes Opito Bay. Other fishing in the area can continue under existing rules.

Director of fisheries management, Emma Taylor says public consultation on the request took place between April and May.

"We received more than 2,000 submissions, with the majority supporting a closure.

"The feedback from tangata whenua and the public reflects the results of recent scientific surveys, commissioned by Fisheries New Zealand. These highlight concerns around the sustainability of scallop stocks right across the northern scallop fisheries, including the east Coromandel area.

"While addressing fishing activity is part of the picture, we also know that scallops are affected by land-based impacts such as sedimentation, and by changes to water quality. "The closure will relieve some of the pressure while work continues by central and local Government to address fishing and non-fishing related impacts.


"A large part of Opito Bay was already closed to commercial scallop harvesting, on top of seasonal restrictions for both recreational and commercial fishing.

"The new closure area is much larger and applies to both recreational and commercial scallop fishing. This will support scallop populations, across a larger area of the coastline and is part of the overall scallop management picture that Fisheries New Zealand is currently considering.

The closure follows a customary rāhui placed by Ngāti Hei on the Opito Bay area in December, to take pressure off the scallop fishery.

"Customary management tools and temporary closures such as rāhui, provide an important mechanism to support the protection of our fisheries resources.

The closure will be legally enforceable from Saturday. Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) fishery officers will continue to patrol the coast supporting



public awareness and enforcing the rules.

Anyone with information about suspected illegal fishing should contact MPI on 0800 4 POACHER to report it.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Ngāti Hei Trust requested a 2-year temporary closure of the scallop fishery over waters of the

east Coromandel coast.

Their application included the extended waters of east Coromandel from Anarake Point to Ruahiwihiwi Point and encompassing offshore waters around the Cuvier, Great Mercury, and Aldermen Islands. This includes Opito Bay which had been subject to a voluntary rāhui put in place by Ngāti Hei.

Public consultation on the Temporary Closure request took place between April and May, including consultation with Ngāti Hei and other tangata whenua, along with commercial and recreational fishers, and environmental interests.

Fisheries New Zealand received a total of 2,381 submissions with the majority of submitters in support of a closure.

The Minister for Oceans and Fisheries approved the temporary closure to the take of scallops for a 2-year period in east Coromandel, pursuant to section 186A of the Fisheries Act 1996, to recognise and make provision for the use and management practices of Ngāti Hei by improving the availability of scallops in this area.

The closure takes effect from Saturday, 11 September 2021.

Our Council wants to ensure any local decisions that are required are made in the best interests of our communities.

The government wants feedback from councils on the potential impacts of the proposed reform by 1 October. Our Councillors have conducted an initial review,

Our Council isn't required at this point in the process to opt in or out of the reforms.
