Call for real estate risk reports

With the risk to coastal communities from climate change and coastal hazards increasing, an independent disaster recovery insurance expert says the Thames-Coromandel District Council should introduce risk reports for all real estate transactions in the district.

Melissa Heath of Residential Risk Analysis predicts that within 10 to 20 years, a portion of homes in the district that are in at-risk areas will be uninsurable and will lose all financial value.

In a hard-hitting speech looking at the Thames-Coromandel District Council's planned shoreline management plan (SMP) from an insurance perspective, Heath told a meeting of the Shoreline Management Plan committee in late May that risk reports. which she said the council could introduce under a clause in the Local Government Act, would be a simple and effective way of allowing the property market to "organically" evolve to more safe and sustainable development, without further input from the council

Risk reports would also allow the TCDC to identify properties that will require council intervention over the next two decades, she added.

In the case of properties which had lost all value, the owners would have nothing other than the physical structure, Heath said.

"Provided these are owners who bought their homes prior to the introduction of risk reports, there may be a simple solution for them. Offer to swap land. Assist with the cost of moving the dwelling to the new land, and in return you cheaply acquire land that is to be retired as residential use or surrendered to the sea. The home owner, with the major asset once more on safe land, finds an instant return of market value.

"A risk report that identifies the true risk exposure to property and its likely insurance impacts will prompt property buyers to seek better investments. FOMO (fear of missing out), will be replaced by more considered due diligence.

While risk was subjective, reports would ensure all buyers would be

fully informed, Heath said.

"Each property buyer that persists in purchasing a risky property, removes the liability load for council as there is no ability to point fingers at council and claim nuisance or negligence on council's behalf."

She said any fears of the property market collapsing because of the risk report requirement were

"We completed a study on actual residential risk in Wellington in 2019. We found that if risk reports were supplied at time of purchase, only 11 per cent of homes would lose value, compared to 29 per cent of homes that could have asked a better price."

Another immediate step to protect the district's property future would be to train planners and consent staff to change their perspective when looking at new development proposals and consent requests, Heath said.



Shoreline plan set for completion next year

The Thames Coromandel District Council is working on a three-year project to prepare adaptive Shoreline Management Plans for large sections of the district's coastline by 2022.

The project aims to help communities and coasts adapt to coastal hazards through site-specific plans for the entire length of the district's coastline, including offshore islands. It involves extensive consultation with residents.

Coastal hazards being considered as part of the SMP project for now and next 100 years include coastal inundation (from high sea level events); tsunami, coastal erosion, cliff/slope instability and flooding (due to catchment runoff from rainfall).

Suella says she saw the need and approached the Community Services Trust to support people "who are doing it tough - either financially or they may be socially isolated - so with Chris Hannah and Heleene White from WCST we put an idea together. It took us a while to get the right venue for the concept and amazingly Reverend Peter from the Anglican church came forward and said yes, you can have Cornerstone.

"We knew they had a strong volunteer base that we could tap into as well, so the concept came together very quickly."

This was only the volunteers third week of Comfort Kai and saw 20 for dinner plus 24 takeouts - The ladies told me "taking a neighbour or those that can't come out or are home based is vital".

Apparently this wonderful concept happens all over NZ and Suella feels its "a really simple formula and with an amazing array of volunteers of eight to ten cooking and serving on a rostered system each Wednesday from 5pm."

I was amazed at the choice of

comfort food that everyone can relate to, and assisted by many, Dandelion Catering gave doughnuts, people giving honey, herbs and flowers and Suella tells us you can donate cash (it is an acceptable commodity to the Whangamatā Community Services Trust, or New World vouchers).

Readers can phone WCST and ask what is on their 'wishlist' to ascertain what they are getting low on in their pantry.

"Basically our aim is to turn out a three course meal for \$1 per head with donations."

Minestrone, beef bolognese, ice cream and peaches, pumpkin soup, devilled sausages, corn bread baskets and fruit crumble. All kiwi favourites are created in a small but busy kitchen.

Fresh produce and fruit are always welcome, but we can't take expired foods or opened goods.

So if you are wanting companionship, and enjoy some music - come along 'the doors are open to everyone', and if you need a pick up or drop off we can work through this with the WCST van.

Suella added "if you want to volunteer, be prepared for a police check to keep in line with the same code of conduct and confidentiality policies of WCST and join in for a fun time in the kitchen with our very cool team."

Following the declaration of a national climate emergency in December 2020, councils now had the teeth to insist that all development was resilient to climate change and the very real possibility of "insurance retreat", she added.

"By adding a small filter to the decision-making process, a significant improvement in the durability of development in the TCDC would occur.

"Is it insurable?' Apply that filter and put the onus on the developer or property owner to prove it is so, then you are good to go on final decisions."

Next year the TCDC will complete

a project to prepare adaptive Shoreline Management Plans (SMP) for large sections of the district's coastline. Heath said the SMP results were likely to identify both private and community assets that were potentially in danger from climate change and natural disasters.

Recommendations on how to deal with these were likely to be expensive and probably out of reach financially, she added.

"This is the time for out-of-thebox solutions. Remember that you have precious data about sea rise that the reinsurers could likely fall over themselves for. Negotiate with them. How much will they pay for it, or can you have partnerships with them in projects to keep insurance on the Coromandel?"

She said TCDC was in a "brilliant" position to consider solutions.

"Very soon you will have relevant data about your own coastlines. The government has declared an emergency which gives you the moral and possibly legal teeth to make changes via bylaw. Public opinion is ready for the changes and most people fear the loss of insurance cover.

"This will be the time to be spectacular as governors of a wonderful part of New Zealand."

The Thames-Coromandel District Council is working through its Shoreline Management Planning process to identify communityled adaptive solutions to address coastal hazard challenges, says mayor Sandra Goudie.

"Our website has much more

"Melissa Heath's presentation on climate change and insurance was to our Shoreline Management Plan Committee on May 27 for information purposes.

"It was not a decision-making

forum. We're in the middle of a much wider conversation with our communities and our partners and a lot more work and discussion is required for any informed decisions to be made," says Goudie.

Ward name change wanted

The name "South East Ward" sounds too much as though it has something to do with a hospital. says Thames-Coromandel District councillor and Whangamatā Community Board member Terry

Walker is backing a push to rename the ward "Paradise Coast", which he says would be much more appropriate. The ward covers Whangamatā, Tairua, Pauanui, Hikuai, Opoutere and Onemana, and Walker says the name has been registered, complete with

a website and toolbox of digital support assets which are free for registered property owners to use.

Walker is now calling for members of the public to have their thoughts on the proposed name change heard by the ward's community boards, who will then inform the electoral authorities.

"This needs to be put out to the communities and responded to by mid-August for any change to be considered."

Beach access work

The Thames-Coromandel District Council has completed beach accessway repairs and removed old and dangerous infrastructure at Whangamatā, Pauanui, Flaxmill Bay and Buffalo Beach.

A TCDC spokesman said all the costs of the access repair work were documented and a report would go to the council and its Emergency Management Committee in August for retroactive, out-of-cycle funding approval.

"To allow repairs and clean-up to get started in a timely fashion, the mayor and deputy mayor have a certain financial delegation which allows them to approve emergency works," the spokesman said.

"This approval then has to go the



full council with all expenses fully documented - which is what will happen at the August meeting."

Meanwhile, access repair around the Coromandel will cost \$235,000, not \$400,000 as claimed by TCDC councillor Terry Walker in an earlier Whangamatā News story.

Labour ignores official advice again

"This Government has big centralisation plans for our entire economy and it is hardly surprising from a Government who has made it plain they think they know

best when it comes to just about everything, including how people should engage with their employer, how they should spend their own money, and even what kind of vehicle is legitimate or not.

"The Labour Party is stacked with former unionists, including the Minister in charge of these ludicrous FPAs, Michael Wood, and it shows

Focus on infrastructure underlies Long Term Plan

Building and maintaining essential infrastructure, meeting legislative requirements and keeping up our current levels of service is the foundation of our 2021-2031 Long Term Plan (LTP), which was adopted by our Council recently.

The average rates increase across the district for this financial year (1 July 2021 – 30 June 2022) is set at 8.8 per cent. District-wide, over the 10 years of the LTP, there will be an average rates rise of 5.1 per cent, or \$195 per year.

"That's about \$4 a week more to pay for a huge range of projects and services right across what our Council delivers," says our Mayor Sandra Goudie.

"Thanks to the strong engagement in this LTP, we've laid a solid foundation to address challenges such as the increasing costs of handling rubbish and recycling, keeping communities supplied with drinking water, planning for sustainable growth and addressing climate change," Mayor Sandra says.

The next decade will see our Council invest \$455 million in capital projects plus more than \$1 billion to fund day-to-day operations such as:

- Handling rubbish and recycling
- Providing clean drinking water

- Treating wastewater
